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COLOSSIANS: Jesus Christ is All-Sufficient

Christ and the Church Colossians 1:18

Col. 1:18, "And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence."

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κεφαλή (kephalē), head

- 1. Literal meaning: the physical part of the body that contains the brain;
- 2. Metaphorical meaning: describes superiority or authority, but in Greek it never describes source or origin;

also used to refer to the "chief" or head cornerstone (Mark 12:10; Acts 4:11) related to the uppermost part or extremity.

Four Realms of Authority

- Dispensationally, Christ was to have been the chief or HEAD cornerstone for Israel at His first coming, and will be at His second (Acts 4:11; 1 Peter 2:7).
- 2. *Humanity*, Christ is the Head of every man (male) (1 Cor. 11:3).
- 3. *Ecclesiologically*, Christ is the Head of the church, His bride (Eph. 5:23; Rev. 19:6–8).
- 4. Cosmically, Christ is the Head of principalities and powers and has the universal lordship (Col. 2:10).
