

Are We Willing to Abide in the Word?

John 8:31

## μαθητής *mathētēs* learner, pupil, disciple, student

- 1. Called but do not believe.
- 2. Called and do believe.
- 3. Called follow intermittently, but are not convinced to continue.
- 4. Convinced but comfortable and complacent. Convinced, but not committed.
- 5. Committed and produce varying degrees of fruit.

Mark 1:17, "Then Jesus said to them, 'Follow Me, and I will make you become fishers of men.'"

Luke 5:11, "So when they had brought their boats to land, they forsook all and <u>followed</u> <u>Him."</u>

μένω *menō* aor act subj 2 plur to remain, abide, stay John 15:1, "I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser.

John 15:2, "Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit.

Abiding in Him = Abiding in the Word
