

## Staircase to Maturity

- 5. Ultimate result: so that they might be spiritually mature reflecting the love of Christ in their lives. Eph. 3:17b–19a
- 4. Purpose: so that they can begin to comprehend the immensity of Christ's love for them. Eph. 3:17b–19a
- 3. Result: so that Christ would make His home in them. Eph. 3:17a
- 2. He prays that the Father would use the H.S. to strengthen them in their sp. life. Eph. 3:16
- 1. Paul prays to the Father of the LJC. Eph. 3:14

## 2. The name of God: Almighty God

Gen. 17:1, "When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, 'I am Almighty God; walk before Me and be blameless."

Ex. 6:3, "I appeared to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, as God Almighty,"

Almighty translates the Hebrew Shaddai

3. God can do everything; He created everything, so His power is immense, greater than anything we can imagine.

Job 42:2, "I know that You can do everything, and that no purpose of Yours can be withheld from You."

4. God's omnipotence and omniscience are interconnected.

To do everything God must also know everything.

Exodus 15:1-6

Deut. 3:24; 33:26, 27

Job 9:4-9

Deut. 3:24, "O Lord GOD, You have begun to show Your servant Your greatness and Your mighty hand, for what god is there in heaven or on earth who can do anything like Your works and Your mighty deeds?"

<u>Deut. 33:26</u>, "There is no one like the God of Jeshurun, Who rides the heavens to help you, and in His excellency on the clouds.

<u>Deut. 33:27</u>, "The eternal God is your refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms; He will thrust out the enemy from before you, and will say, 'Destroy!'

Rom. 8:31, "What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?"
